







- Set goals and reflect on their progress.





ACADEMICALLY

Your child should begin to...

- ★ Recognize and write their first name
- ★ Listen and attend to a story
- ★ Follow a 2-3 step direction
- ★ Identify simple patterns
- ★ Recognize simple shapes, letters, sounds, and colors
- ★ Count to 10 and demonstrate oneto-one correspondence



PHYSICALLY

Your child should begin to...

- ★ Write, draw, cut, color and complete puzzles
- ★ Play safely on the playground equipment
- ★ Eat and open containers independently
- ★ Have a consistent sleep pattern and eat healthy foods
- ★ Have independent personal care skills (bathroom/clothing)

SOCIALLY

Your child should begin to...

- ★ verbalize wants and needs
- ★ play independently
- ★ cooperate and share
- ★ take turns/waiting their turn
- ★ use words to solve problems
- ★ follow routines and rules



TECHNOLOGICALLY

- ★ Expose your child to different technology devices if accessible
- ★ Practice using a mouse or touchpad (FCPS laptops do not have touch screen capabilities)
- ★ Practice appropriate use of technology

Formal Assessments in Kindergarten

VKRP(Virginia Kindergarten Readiness Program)

- State mandated
- Given one on one in the fall and spring
- EMAS (Early Math Assessment System)
- CBRS (social emotional rating scale)
- PALS (Phonological Awareness Literacy Screening)

SEL(Social Emotional Learning)

- Division wide assessment
- Screening questions completed by teacher in winter and spring



ESOL (English Speakers of Other Languages) Services

Screening for ESOL Services:

- Home Language Survey
- WIDA Screener, given in September
- The results of WIDA Screener determine the eligibility for ESOL services

ESOL Instruction is:

- English Language Development instruction (ELD)
 - in listening, speaking, reading, and writing
 - across the content areas of math, science, language arts, and social studies
 - data driven
- Part of core instruction
- Culturally and linguistically appropriate instruction
- · Provided in the classroom



Special Education Services

NFES Special Education Team

- 8 special education teachers
- 8 instructional assistants
- Teach special education students: K 6 and Enhanced Autism Program (K - 4)

Related Services Providers shared with other schools

- Speech and Language
- Occupational Therapy
- Adapted P.E.
- Assistive Technology Services
- Behavior Intervention Services
- Applied Behavior Analysis

 - FCPS Social Worker




Multi - Purpose Referral Form


